

MUSIC NOTES

The simple harmonies that Sergei Rachmaninoff uses in his setting of *Bogoroditse Devo* transport the listener to a massive and resonant cathedral space in Russia where the unique timbre of the choir, from the delicate blend of the sopranos to the booming bass notes of the oktavists (basso profundos) evoke how Mary must have felt when the Angel Gabriel alerted her to how her life and the world were about to change.

John Rutter is internationally known as one of the most talented and prolific writers of choral music, particularly many well-known and programmed works during the Advent and Christmas season. *What Sweeter Music* and *The Holly and the Ivy* are counterparts in that the former is gentle and delicate and the latter is rhythmic and buoyant.

Sleeps Judea Fair by Hugh MacKinnon, who was for many years organist and choirmaster at Grace Cathedral in San Francisco, is a serene carol that twice juxtaposes the first phrase of *Silent Night* with MacKinnon's own music, first in the organ accompaniment and later with the addition of a soprano soloist.

The Choir Carols in this evening's service include two World Premieres by leading Norwegian composer, Kim André Arnesen, that were commissioned in celebration of BMPC 150th anniversary year. *Christmas* uses a text by Euan Tait that not only humanizes Jesus but uses imagery of water and music that all parents can relate to, from those early moments of parenthood, bathing and singing to a child and interacting with them through moments of exhaustion but creating cherished memories during these fleeting moments of childhood. *Christmastide* uses a text by Charles Anthony Silvestri that beautifully depicts how it felt to be a shepherd taking in the joy and awe surrounding the hills of Bethlehem on that special night when Jesus was born. A third selection by Arnesen, *I Will Light Candles This Christmas*, takes place near the end of the service and not only touches on the nostalgic themes of Christmas, but more importantly on the work that must be done to honor the Christ child.
