This year promises to be a particularly poignant season, as the church celebrates 150 years of ministry to the community and looks ahead to the coming years. To that end, we have commissioned internationally renowned composer, Kim André Arnesen to compose new works for BMPC. We have invited Philippe Lefebvre, organist of Notre Dame Cathedral, and James Kealeu, winner of the prestigious National Young Artists Competition in organ to perform on the church's fabulous Rieger organ. We will offer a concert for two harpsichords and instruments. a local premiere of Hugh McEluea's "Tenebrae: The Passion of Dietrich Bonhoeffer. and Brahms' "A German Requiem," performed with the composer's arrangement for two pianos. These events, along with an Advent harpsichord series, a Lenten organ series, and a outrageously funny Midwinter Festival, promise to stir your soul and lighten the continued burdens of this postpandemic era.
