WePAC was born at Bryn Mawr Presbyterian Church in 2003-04. It addresses early childhood literacy by re-opening formerly closed Philadelphia public elementary school libraries, and staffing them with skilled volunteers, donated resources, and reading enrichment activities. Approximately 95% of Philadelphia public elementary schools do not have a functioning library. WePAC runs 18 school libraries and serves over 4,000 students throughout the school year, many of whom have no books in their homes and live at the poverty level. More than 45,000 books are circulated annually through this program.

The Welcome Church is a worshiping community that grew out of The Welcome Center, a place of healing and hospitality, which was founded in 2007. In 2012, The Welcome Church was officially recognized by the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America as a congregation under development, serving people in poverty and especially people experiencing homelessness in Philadelphia. This congregation has a unique focus on the spiritual and relational health of women experiencing homelessness. It offers information, worship, fellowship, personal care items and other assistance twice a month on the Benjamin Franklin Parkway in Philadelphia.



A Garden Tool

The Urban Tree Connection (UTC) works with residents of West Philadelphia's Haddington neighborhood to develop community-driven greening and gardening projects on vacant land. It has adjusted and responded to COVID-19 during the 2020 growing season while maintaining the planting and harvesting the bounty at its Neighborhood Food Farm and Community Garden. The aim is to cultivate community leadership, improve community health, and develop a local sustainable food system. Over the past 25 years, UTC has redeveloped 29 vacant lots, totaling more than 86,000 square feet of land for communal growing and gathering, sustainable food production and distribution, and multigenerational health and wellness education. This includes its three quarter acre urban farm - Neighborhood Foods Farm, which produces over 10,000 pounds of produce annually. UTC has been at the forefront of urban farming and land reclamation movements in Philadelphia, helping pioneer key tools for legal reclamation of abandoned properties.

BMPC's PC (USA) Mission Coworker Jed Koball is working in

some of the most polluted and devastated land in the world, yet, hope prevails. His most direct and hands-on environmental work continues to be in the La Oroya, Peru area with a focus on re-forestation and bio-remediation. This area is deeply impacted by heavy metals contamination. It is also highly susceptible to climate change impact. More than 30,000 trees have been planted on the Conservation Committee of Villa el Sol's communal land on the outskirts of La Oroya. This gift of three trees will be planted in a sustainable way. Technical expertise and traditional indigenous wisdom is utilized to implement a water captation project, and native plants help remove toxins from the soil.

The BMPC Hunger Committee's mission is to help as many of the area's hungriest neighbors as possible through the active support of local food cupboards and shelters. This is accomplished by direct financial support assistance as well as through other means, such as supplying nourishing casseroles and nonperishable foods donated by our congregation. Philadelphia has one of the highest poverty and hunger rates in the country, and the coronavirus pandemic and economic downturn have further increased the need. Because society's safety net is contracting, the food agencies that BMPC supports are a vital part of the fight against hunger in the Philadelphia area.

Financial Assistance to Local Musicians Financial Assistance to Local Musicians

The Philadelphia Musicians Relief Fund was created in March 2020 with the goal of providing emergency financial assistance to local freelance musicians (who are BMPC music-making partners) experiencing a lack of income due to the COVID-19 crisis. These artists are an essential part of the city's cultural life and perform with The Chamber Orchestra of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania Ballet, Opera Philadelphia, The Academy of Vocal Arts, Walnut Street Theatre, The Philly POPS, Broadway Philadelphia, and numerous other groups. Income for many musicians is predominately on a per-service basis. This gift will help meet the immediate financial needs of those experiencing severe economic distress.

Broad Street Ministry (BSM) is a Christian community that honors creativity in all it pursues, strives to extend hospitality intentionally to each and all, and works tirelessly for a more just and compassionate Philadelphia. BSM is a faith community that follows the call of Jesus to heal those who hurt, feed those who hunger, and speak up for those whose voices are silenced. Each year BSM provides thousands of meals, a mailing address, clothing and social service referrals to hundreds of hungry, homeless and needy Philadelphians. Broad Street Ministry hopes to have its mission, its values, and its commitments shaped by the rich cultural context in which it is located along the Avenue of the Arts in Center City Philadelphia. This gift will help support the work of BSM's Hospitality Collaborative by providing blue jeans, a much-needed item, distributed through the clothing closet.

Community Support and Relief during the COVID-19 Pandemic

West Kensington Ministry has served the neighborhood of West Kensington since 2008. For over 10 years, this Presbyterian congregation has been a hub of community engagement, performing arts and advocacy and mentoring for youth in a section of Philadelphia designated as one of the most economically disenfranchised areas. When the COVID-19 pandemic began this spring, WKM also became a center for supporting those most deeply impacted by the quarantines by offering an extensive food and support ministry. Since March, it has consistently distributed 500 pallets of food per week which are donated by the Share Food Program. This gift will help with all of the additional costs incurred through these relief efforts as West Kensington Ministry continues to support and care for its neighbors in need.



Purchase One T-Shirt for Memorial Displays

Illegal handguns cause devastating impacts on innocent children and adults in many communities. Memorial to the Lost T-shirt displays naming each victim, his or her age and date of death stand as moving testimony to the consequences of these crimes. Sponsored by Heeding God's Call to End Gun Violence, an interfaith group, these memorials have been effective at galvanizing faith communities across Pennsylvania to stop this calamity in our neighborhoods. There is proof it has worked in Philadelphia. Committed faith leaders and congregation members stood in witness in front of a gun shop notorious for selling guns to straw purchasers, guns later used to kill and maim. As a result of their efforts, this gun shop was closed and charged by the U.S. Attorney with providing false documentation on purchases. This gift will purchase one T-shirt for the memorial and raise a voice to God's call to "not be overcome by evil, but to overcome eviol with good."

Trauma Therapy for Children and Adults at Jane Addams Place Shelter

Lutheran Settlement House was established in 1902 as a non-profit, community-based organization committed to serving vulnerable children, adults, and families in Philadelphia. At Jane Addams Place, their emergency shelter for families experiencing homelessness, families come to the shelter carrying the trauma that led to their homelessness. With up to 30 adults and 70 children living at Jane Addams Place at any given time, a variety of age-appropriate programming and a full-time trauma therapist helps parents and their children process their pre-shelter experiences while preparing them for life after shelter in a home of their own. Jane Addams Place is the only shelter in Philadelphia to have a full-time on-site trauma therapist to help families move from fear and uncertainty to stability and hope.

Not only does this meet a basic human need, but it can also boost children's self-esteem during a very stressful transition and time in their lives. This gift shows these vulnerable children that many people care about them. Gemma's work is guided by the vision of a world in which every child, youth, and family feels valued and has the tools to realize their highest potential. 
Transportation to a Vital Medical Appointment \$15

ElderNet serves people of all ages, especially frail older adults and younger disabled persons with low to moderate incomes residing in Lower Merion or Narberth. This agency helps older neighbors remain independent and provides a variety of free, practical services enabling access to healthcare, food security, and an improved quality of life. ElderNet also offers information to individuals who need assistance with housing, nursing care and other necessities. This organization is staffed by licensed social workers and professionals who are available to help those in need.

Training for One Child Rights Activist

Beyond Borders is building the Movement to End Child Domestic Slavery and Other Practices that Imperil Children in Haiti. The goal of this program is to equip and mobilize communities in order to ensure that children enjoy their full rights, including the right to a family, and to live in security. To date, Beyond Borders has trained and engaged 900+ adult survivors of child slavery and thousands of other Child Rights Activists to mobilize their neighborhoods to stop the practice of enslaving children.

Emergency Relief Vouchers for Families in Lebanon



As the country of Lebanon struggles through a devastating economic collapse, which began in August 2019, the Presbyterian Church in Lebanon and Syria has responded to the staggering need by providing relief to the hundreds of thousands of Syrian refugees and now impoverished Lebanese citizens unable to provide for themselves. The World Food Program anticipates that by the end of 2020 there will be an equivalent need between Syrian refugees and Lebanese residents in the country. This gift to the National Evangelical Synod of Syria and Lebanon will be used toward vouchers distributed by the churches around the country so that families may be able to purchase basic daily necessities.



Bethel AME Church of Ardmore is responding to the needs of students and families in Lower Merion and Haverford Townships in three ways - a Student Access Center, which provides support to families during online and hybrid school sessions, especially for families who do not have adults in the home during the school day; Bethel Academy, which provides one-on-one afterschool tutoring support in a virtual format, and the Bethel Victory Community Garden initiative, which has provided over 4,000 pounds of organic produce for local families and pantries from its on-site garden and sponsored home garden sites. This gift will help provide school supplies for the students supported by Bethel AME.
