BULLETIN COVER

"Joseph and His Brothers"

Our four-year-olds learn about God's ongoing story through the unique curriculum, "Young Children and Worship," adapted from Maria Montessori's teaching methods. The curriculum's wooden figures and objects shown on this summer's bulletin covers are used repeatedly to help children identify a pattern.

Young children know what it is to feel jealous, compassionate, angry, empathetic, and even betrayed. We know that infants are quick to recognize helping versus hindering behavior. Stories like Joseph's help our youngest children connect their own experiences to the biblical narrative. It gives them a natural foothold into the larger story of God's people.

Our summer sermon series is based upon the Old Testament stories we teach to our youngest children, hoping that children in worship will recognize them and the child in each of us will recall the foundational biblical witness for the life of faith.
