

WHITE FRAGILITY: WHY IT'S SO HARD FOR WHITE PEOPLE TO TALK ABOUT RACE. Sundays at 11:15 a.m. starting Jan. 10, via Zoom conference call. Join BMPC members Courtenay Willcox and Amy Ballard in a six-week discussion of Robin DiAngelo's bestselling book on the work of anti-racism and how we as white folks can rethink our own privilege and equip ourselves to listen and learn from others. Whether you are just getting started in this work, or simply looking for an encouraging and yet challenging place to practice having conversations on race and privilege, this is the place for you. RACISM: POWER, PRIVILEGE, POISON AND PROMISING POSSIBILITIES. Sun., Jan. 24, 2:00 – 3:00 p.m., and Sundays, Jan. 31 – Feb. 14, 2:00 – 5:00 p.m., via Zoom conference call. This workshop, led by Anita Friday, anti-racism educator and activist, will explore America's relationship with racism by examining its history, laws and institutional practices. Participants will be invited to explore their personal experiences with questions of ethnicity and race. In addition, during the workshop, participants learn about institutional practices that have shaped how various citizens are able to participate in the nation, how racism has affected Black people and how to define and distinguish white supremacy and white privilege, i.e. ethnically-based inequalities.
