Summer choir is simple (one anthem, hymns, and a closing response), and informal (no robes). No long-term commitment; no need to sign up in advance.

NATIVE PLANT PROJECT. Prioritizing native plants on the BMPC campus and in backyard gardens, the newest initiative from the BMPC Environmental Justice Committee, offers opportunities to better understand the importance of native plants that support local insects, birds, and other creation allies. Increasing biodiversity is a vital task that all of us can do. It's easy, inexpensive, and helps to create a holy greenway for native species. New plant markers with QR codes have been placed around the church campus to help identify native plantings. When you find a marker, scan the QR code using the camera on your cell phone to learn more about each plant.
