

MOVEMENT FOR FEMINISM AND FREEDOM IN IRAN. 11:15 a.m., Fullerton Room. In response to the death of Iranian Kurdish woman Mahsa Amini, women and men in Iran have taken to the streets to protest the treatment of women. We will be joined by Homa Tavangar, educator and writer on issues of global citizenship and equity, and Dr. Shahrzad Missaghi, who was raised in the Baha'i community in Iran which has worked to foster values of education and inclusion while being persecuted by the Iranian government. Homa and Shahrzad will share their stories as well as those of others fighting for equality in Iran today.
