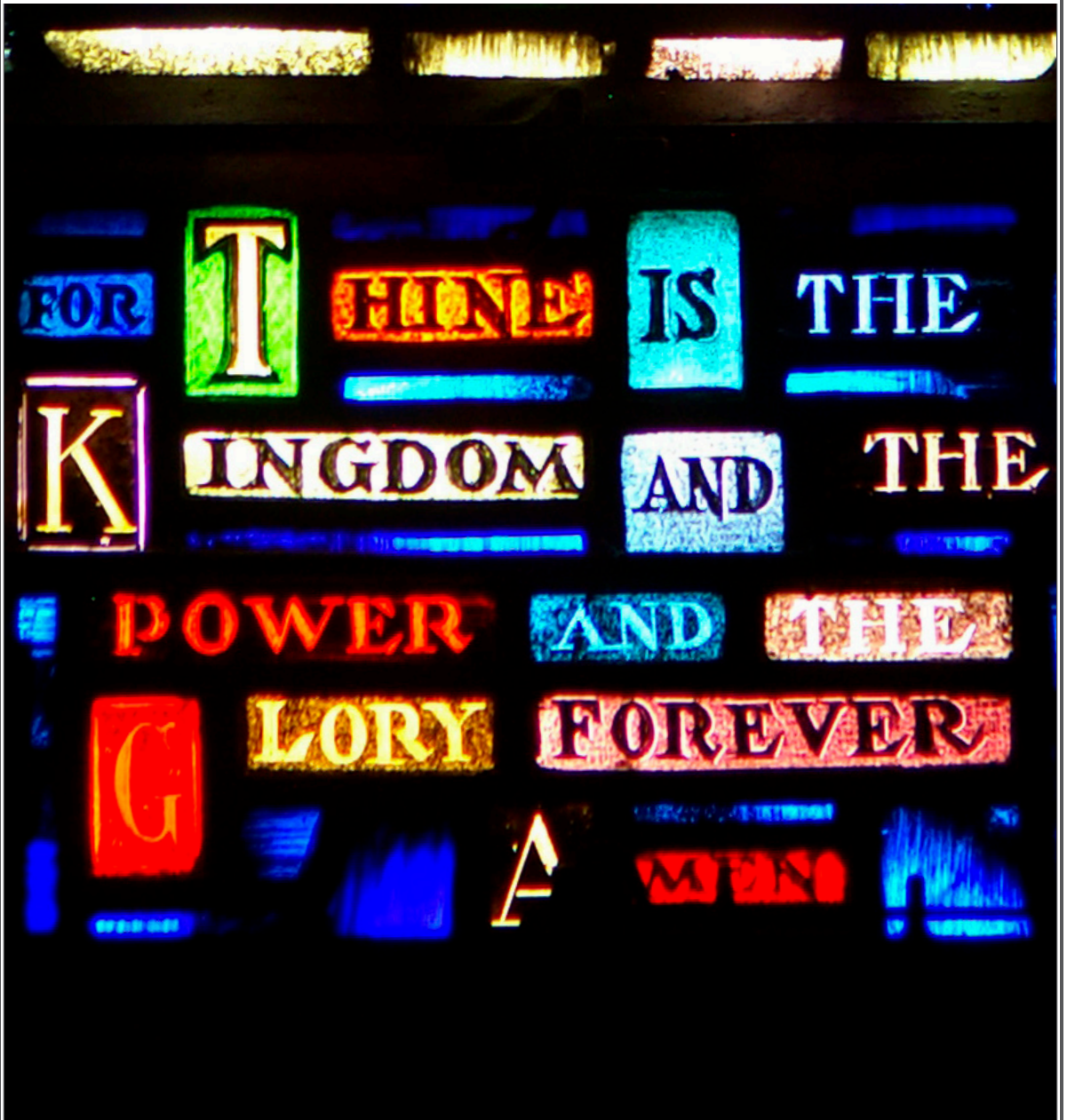

Music Notes

Albert Hay Malotte was born on May 19, 1895, in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Malotte developed an interest in music at an early age and was a choir boy at St. James Episcopal Church in Philadelphia, under the direction of his father, Charles, who was choirmaster there. Later in life, Malotte studied under Victor Herbert and received further training in organ, voice and composition abroad and worked as a concert organist for several years. His interest in the American West eventually took him to Hollywood, California, where he worked for Walt Disney Studios. While at Disney, Malotte composed the scores for several of the company’s Silly Symphonies, including the Academy Award-winning Ferdinand and the Bull (1938) and The Ugly Duckling (1939). Malotte’s setting of The Lord’s Prayer (1935) is unquestionably the most popular version in the repertoire.

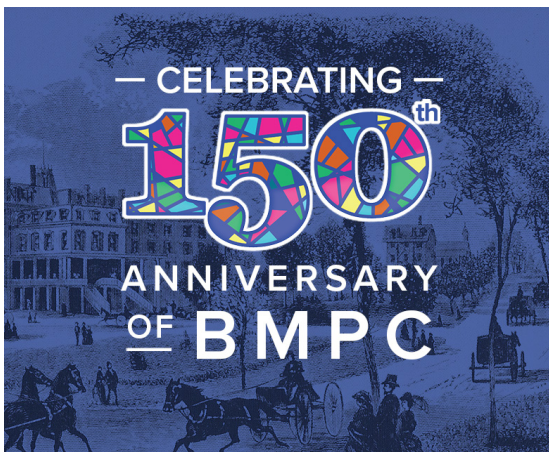
