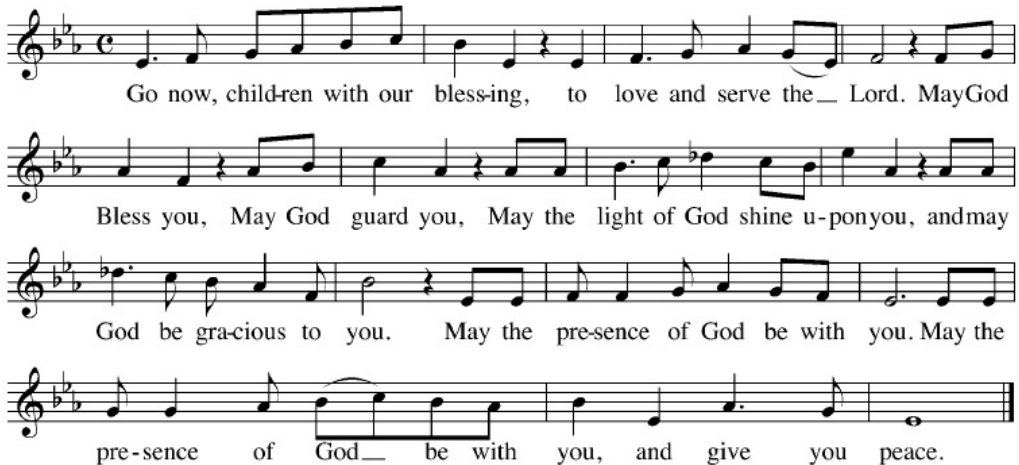

THE PRELUDE AND THE ANTHEM

Charles Hubert Hastings Parry played an important role in that second Renaissance of English music known as the “Anglican Revival.” For some 100 years after Handel, Britain had seen a steady decline in the whole of its music scene. Parry used his strengths as a composer, scholar and educator to reverse the trend, paving the way for the Elgars, Stanfords, Vaughan Williamses, and other legends of the revival. With virtually simultaneous “hits” in 1880, at the famed Crystal Palace (*Piano Concerto in F-sharp*) and at the Gloucester Festival (*Scenes from Prometheus Unbound*), Parry catapulted himself to prominence - a position he enjoyed until his death. In 1902, he was called upon to set the anthem “I Was Glad” for the coronation of Edward VII - creating a vital and enduring work that has rightfully taken its place in both the coronation and cathedral repertoires.
