

PREACHING FROM THE LECTIONARY

Today's sermon is based on the Epistle reading appointed for this day by the Revised Common Lectionary. The lectionary is a list of readings from the Bible for use in Christian worship, making provision for the liturgical year with its pattern of observances of festivals and seasons. Each Sunday four readings are suggested from the Old Testament, a Psalm, a Gospel and one of the Epistles. The lectionary follows a three-year cycle based on readings from Matthew, Mark and Luke (the synoptic gospels with parallel narratives of the life of Jesus), with readings from John interspersed in all three years. Appointing particular readings for certain days grew out of Judaism and was later adopted by Catholic and Protestant churches. BMPC pastors typically use the Revised Common Lectionary most weeks, but deviate from it for topical series or to address current global, community or pastoral concerns before the congregation.

PREACHING FROM THE LECTIONARY

Today's sermon is based on the Epistle reading appointed for this day by the Revised Common Lectionary. The lectionary is a list of readings from the Bible for use in Christian worship, making provision for the liturgical year with its pattern of observances of festivals and seasons. Each Sunday four readings are suggested from the Old Testament, a Psalm, a Gospel and one of the Epistles. The lectionary follows a three-year cycle based on readings from Matthew, Mark and Luke (the synoptic gospels with parallel narratives of the life of Jesus), with readings from John interspersed in all three years. Appointing particular readings for certain days grew out of Judaism and was later adopted by Catholic and Protestant churches. BMPC pastors typically use the Revised Common Lectionary most weeks, but deviate from it for topical series or to address current global, community or pastoral concerns before the congregation.
