Fauré's *Requiem*

Few choral works evoke as much reverence and heartfelt emotion as Gabriel Fauré's *Requiem*. Traditionally the Roman Catholic Mass for the dead, the Requiem genre has become popular in all Christian traditions for its texts of prayer, supplication, and enduring hope. Gabriel Fauré, working in Paris, was a highly acclaimed organist and a composer of piano music and small-scale instrumental pieces. He completed his *Requiem* in 1893, shortly after the death of both of his parents. He said, “I see death...as a joyful deliverance, an aspiration toward a happiness beyond the grave, rather than as a painful experience.” This message comes across in the music, and its beauty and transcendence have helped to make it a mainstay of choral literature.

We are pleased to perform it today with the Bryn Mawr Chamber Singers. Special thanks to our guests, harpist Samantha Wittchen and violinist Alexandra Cutler-Fetkewicz.
