NATIVE PLANT PROJECT. Prioritizing native plants on the BMPC campus and in backyard gardens - the newest initiative from the BMPC Environmental Justice Committee - offers opportunities to better understand the importance of native plants that support local insects, birds, and other creation allies. Increasing biodiversity is a vital task that all of us can do. It's easy, inexpensive, and helps to create a holy greenway for native species. New plant markers with QR codes have been placed around the church campus to help identify native plantings.
