





<u>Music Notes</u>

Fauré's "Requiem"

Few choral works evoke as much reverence and heartfelt emotion as Gabriel Fauré's Requiem. Traditionally the Roman Catholic Mass for the dead, the Requiem genre has become popular in all Christian traditions for its texts of prayer, supplication, and enduring hope. Gabriel Fauré, working in Paris, was a highly acclaimed organist and a composer of piano music and smallscale instrumental pieces. He completed his Requiem in 1893, shortly after the death of both of his parents. He said, "I see death…as a joyful deliverance, an aspiration toward a happiness beyond the grave, rather than as a painful experience." This message comes across in the music, and its beauty and transcendence have helped to make it a mainstay of choral literature.

We are pleased to perform it today with the BMPC Sanctuary Choir. Special thanks to our guests, harpist Claire Thai and violinist Luigi Mazzocchi.

Celebrating César Franck

2022 marks the bicentennial of César Franck (1822-1890), the most significant composer of organ repertoire during the 19th century. During the month of November, preludes and a few postludes will highlight some of his most admired and performed works, including the complete *Trois Pièces*, as well as other selections from the *Six Pièces*, and the monumental Choral III. These works are particularly wedded to BMPC's Rieger organ as the voicing of the pipework captures the timbres that were so important and influential to Franck's organ works: the warm foundations, the delicate oboe, as well as the mysterious *Voix Humaine*, the organ's attempt to imitate the human voice.
