



MUSIC NOTES

This morning's special prelude for Pentecost comes from French composer Maurice Duruflé's *Prélude, Adagio et Choral Varié sur le thème du "Veni Creator," Op. 4.* This monumental work concludes with four variations and a blazing toccata that uses all the resources of the organ. We will present the work as Duruflé intended, with the Gregorian chant sung by the men of the choir between each of the verses.

The offertory anthem, "Veni Sancte Spiritus" is by Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart. This jubilant work for choir and four soloists was composed when Mozart was only 12 years old, probably while he was on tour through Italy with his father and sister. It shows the exuberance of a pre-teen with the stunning originality of one of music's greatest geniuses.
